

Working Equitation with Megan Joerg - May 28, 2023



Megan is returning to **Bungendore Riding Club** to conduct another day-long Working Equitation (WE) training day. WE is a relatively new sport in Australia and while there are not many accredited coaches as yet, Megan is a passionate supporter of the sport. Megan is based in Blayney, NSW and spends many weeks of the year travelling to riding clubs and conducting Working Equitation training days and Clinics. Her qualifications include:

- 2021 National Working Equitation Masters Champion
- Accredited Australian National Working Equitation coach
- Equestrian Australia level 2 Dressage
- Level 2 General and Coach Educator and Coach Assessor
- Jumping Equitation Judge Educator qualification level 4

Megan will be conducting 45 min sessions with two riders per session. There will be 3-4 obstacles taught in each session.

Riders need to nominate their dressage level (if available) so we can put similar rider levels together. The day will begin at **8:30am** and all riders are asked to be warmed up in time for their session.

Venue: **Bungendore Showgrounds Covered Arena**, riders note we are sharing the grounds with the Wamboin Pony Club Mounted Games that day.

Lesson Costs are \$70 per rider and includes Lunch (Barbeque/Sausage Sizzle)

We will also be setting up some sporting games in another area of the grounds for you to have a play with if you'd like to come down with your horse but don't want a paired lesson, just an outing.

Sporting Costs \$10 per rider and includes Lunch (Barbeque/Sausage Sizzle)

{Lesson riders do not need to also register for sporting games but are free to participate if they like}

CODE OF CONDUCT, SAFETY and INSURANCE

Please ensure that your gear/equipment/horse/pony is in good safe working order. If you are riding, you will be required to wear a riding helmet approved by the EA (Equestrian Australia) and appropriate riding clothing and footwear.

BRC is an EA affiliated club and as such is covered by Public Liability Insurance. EA members are also covered under insurance whilst riding and training their horses. However, being a BRC member only does not mean that you are automatically covered under insurance. You should consider if holding your own personal accident or loss of income insurance is right for you if you are not also an EA member.
